REDEFINING EDUCATION BY INTRODUCING SKILL VOCATION

National Education Policy-2020 has emphasised on promoting Skill Education in schools. In compliance with it, School has introduced nine Skill Modules (each of 12-15 hours duration) for students of classes VI-VIII.

Skill modules introduced in classes VI-VIII are Artificial Intelligence, Beauty & Wellness, Design Thinking and Innovation, Financial Literacy, Handicrafts, Mass Media, What to do when Doctor is not Around, How to make a Graphic Novel and Data Science.

These skill subjects are aligned to the Skill subjects being offered in Secondary and Senior Secondary classes.
